Notes

1. Part time study is available for these courses, please contact the College for further details. The tuition fee is spread evenly over the years of study. The course may be completed over a period between one and five years.

2. All students enrolled on a validated course are required to pay this fee annually, which is set to cover Open University charges. This fee applies for the first three years of study on this programme.

3. Tuition fees are spread over the period during which study is undertaken. Annual University registration fees also apply.

4. The College offers a Bridging course for the entry into the MA programme. For further information, please contact MA programme admissions via email MA@allnations.ac.uk.

Where two or more Bridging modules are completed and paid for in full, students may be eligible for a credit towards the first term fees of the postgraduate course, as follows:

Two modules: £120 credit; Three modules £240 credit; Four modules £360 credit. £360 represents the maximum credit towards the first-term postgraduate course fees.

This credit is only applicable where the student continues onto the postgraduate programme. No discount or refund will be applied if the student is not enrolled on or accepted into the postgraduate programme.

5. This is the annual student body fee for campus access and hybrid access learners.

6-7. The full-time fee applies to those attending more than three days per week. Students attending three days or fewer per week will be charged the part-time fee. Students who primarily study remotely may instead pay a per day charge for occasional visits to campus. The fee includes access to all student areas on site, as well as weekday lunches and drinks during term time.

Other charges:

Application fees: £60 for postgraduate courses. This is non-refundable.

Course Deposit fees: £400 for all courses. This is non-refundable but will be deducted from your course fees.

Making payments: The College does not accept payments in cash. Payments may be made directly to the College bank account via BACS or standing order, via the College website or by card payment where available.

Guest attendance at lectures: This may be possible with the prior consent of the lecturer concerned. The first hour is free, subsequent hours are charged at £20 per hour.

Continuation Fees: if you continue beyond the normal length of your course there will be additional costs. The Postgraduate Continuation fees are £545 per annum.

Room deposits (on site): A room deposit of £250, will be required for students in full board accommodation. This deposit will be refunded, subject to the accommodation being left in an acceptable condition. Deposits must be paid via the College website at the same time as the course deposit, upon acceptance of a place.
