This page explains what they are, since by enrolling on a programme of study with us, you will be entering into a legally binding contract with the College.

Intellectual Property: You will own the rights to work produced by you during your time as a student, unless, by prior arrangement, you have collaborated with the College in its production, in which case ownership will be agreed beforehand.

Distance Learners (RAL and online): Please note that students who learn from a distance are not governed by any regulations that relate purely to those being physically on campus. However, they become applicable during any period of time when a distance learner comes to College and studies and/or lives as a residential student e.g. during an intensive module.

Cancellation Rights: Once you have accepted your offer of a place at the College you have 14 days in which to cancel your acceptance ("The Cancellation Period") and you can do so for any reason. To exercise the right to cancel, you must inform the College of your decision to cancel this Contract. You may use our <u>Acceptance Cancellation Form</u>, or you can send an email to the undergraduate/postgraduate administrator. (See Payment Terms and Conditions).

Liabilities: The College does not exclude or limit in any way its liability for (a) death or personal injury caused by its negligence or the negligence of its employees, agents or subcontractors; or (b) fraud or fraudulent misrepresentation.

General: If any provision of the Contract between you and the College is held to be void or unenforceable in whole or in part by any court or other competent authority, the Contract shall continue to be valid as to the other provisions contained in it and /or the remainder of the affected provision.

The Contract shall be governed by and construed in all aspects in accordance with the English law and the parties agree to submit to the exclusive jurisdiction of the English courts.

The Contract between you and the College can only be enforced by either you or the College. The Contracts (Rights of Third Parties) Act 1999 does not apply.

Accommodation: Please note that onsite accommodation is not guaranteed and separate terms and conditions apply to your occupation of College-owned accommodation which are not part of the Student Contract.
