

## **Modular Study Options – 2023/24 (Undergraduate programme only)**

This document applies to those who wish to take individual modules rather than follow a full time programme of study. Unfortunately, it is not possible to individualise modular study options but we offer the following range of packages:

### **Basic package**

This entails a *basic fee* and is designed for people who do not live in College accommodation and would like to attend classes for up to four modules per term either as a remote access learner, or a campus access learner. They would not be involved in the community life of the College. They would not be required to take part in chores or maintenance. Any completed assignments would not be marked by tutors/lecturers. The fee charged is per module taken.

### **Standard package**

This entails a *standard fee* and is designed for those who would like to take part in the College community (see below for details) but who do not wish to commit to studying full time. The fee is equal to half the full termly fee, so effectively they are signing up to be a half-time student. Students may choose whether they wish to complete the assignments. Any completed assignments will be marked. They will be part of the student body, need to pay the student body fee, amenities fee if applicable, and will be expected to take part in chores and maintenance. They will be able to take up to 2 modules.

### **Standard Plus**

This is the same as the standard package but is for those who wish to take 3 modules rather than 2.

### **Guided Personal Study (GPS)**

This entails a full termly fee with 4 modules available for study. Other terms are the same as for the Standard packages. In addition, full-time students are given greater priority for on-site accommodation, if available.

### **Spouses**

Spouses of full time residential students may take advantage of a special version of the Basic package. They may take modules at the *basic fee*, but will be allowed all the community involvement, as long as they are willing to take part in chores & maintenance and pay the amenities fee if applicable. Any completed assignments will not be marked on this fee. (All full-board spouses should be studying a minimum of one module per term.)

### **General**

Since modular students cannot be registered with the Open University, any marked assignments will not gain transferrable credits. The College will however provide all students with a letter of attendance or transcript stating the modules were part of The OU validated undergraduate programme.

Regardless of which package is selected, students will be expected to abide by all relevant College policies, particularly the College Code of Conduct and the Student Payment Policy.

All module students are welcome to attend the Sunday evening worship service and Wednesday morning Community Worship. Students on packages other than the Basic one are encouraged to additionally attend: Kick Off, tutor groups, Contemporary Issues in Mission (CIM), and social events.

## Amenities Fee

All students who are Campus Access Learners for Standard, Standard+, GPS or Spouse packages will need to pay the Amenities fee **if** they are not living or staying in College accommodation (whether full board or in a self-catered property). See Amenities Fee sheet for further details.

## Accommodation

We usually have spare capacity for single or shared rooms; couples and family accommodation is more limited and allocated on a points system. Please see our policy document on accommodation priorities for more details.

For family rented accommodation on site, which is self-catered, full time students are given higher priority in the allocations than those who wish to only do modules.

## During the Holidays

Should modular students visit the College during the holidays, (unless attending a short course), please note that facilities which they might normally expect to enjoy may not be available to them, since we run as a conference centre at this time. For example:

- There is absolutely NO ACCESS to any student's term time accommodation
- The only lounge available to you during the holidays is the Aspen lounge
- Only one College car is available to be booked during the holidays
- Meals are only available on a full-board rate over the holidays and must be pre-booked and paid for.
- The College is completely closed at Christmas (from the evening of the last working day until offices open again after the New Year) and Easter (Maundy Thursday evening until the following Tuesday). We cannot accommodate any guests or students staying at College during these periods unless they are a family in a self-catering unit.
